



Participant Solicitation: Treatment of Adolescents with Eating Disorders

This solicitation is intended for therapists who are **currently** treating someone diagnosed with an eating disorder in individual psychotherapy.

We are interested in your experience as a therapist of adolescents (13 to 18 years old) with eating disorders, and in particular, characteristics of the treatment you provide. Related, we are interested in understanding how your therapeutic relationship and emotional responses toward your patient influence the treatment process.
